Dear St. Elizabeth Parish family,

Merry Christmas! Happy Feast of the Holy Family! Let us pray in a special way this weekend for Fr. Jeff and our neighbors as they celebrate their parish feast day.

We resume school on Wednesday with All School Mass at 8:15 a.m. for the Feast of the Holy Name of Jesus. We want to pray for all our Men's Club members on their feast day – we are so grateful for all you do! The whole month of January is traditionally dedicated to the Holy Name of Jesus, so keep that special intention running all month long.

If you still need a 2018 calendar, we have plenty left, just contact the parish office.

Again, please let me know how you liked the new Advent & Christmas spiritual reading books from Ave Maria Press. They all disappeared fast! I hope they have helped you find a few quiet moments each day amid all the busyness of this season. We'll do it again next year, pending your feedback.

This coming weekend as we celebrate the Epiphany of the Lord, I want to make note to say that I am serving as organist at a 1 p.m. Wedding Mass in St. Charles County, MO, on the 6th and cannot guarantee what time I will be back to hear confessions prior to 4:30 Mass. I know I will not be here at 3 p.m. but I hope to arrive by 3:45 and appreciate your understanding. The Mass is a Solemn High Mass in the Extraordinary Form of the Roman Rite (Latin, 1962 Missal) and my friend who is the celebrant needed somebody who was familiar with the Ancient Use of the Mass to play the organ. Please pray for all those who will be married in the church in 2018! May the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph guide their hearts always!

During the 40 days of Christmas, we will be using the Kyrie from Mass VIII (the Mass of the Angels) during the Penitential Rite. If you ever watch Mass on TV, especially EWTN, you have very likely heard this one many times, so please sing along as we pray this Apostolic prayer imploring the Lord's Mercy before we enter into the Liturgy of the Word and the Liturgy of the Eucharist.

Even though Dec. 31 / Jan. 1 does not carry an obligation to attend Mass this year, there are still special indulgenced prayers one can pray on New Year's Eve and New Year's Day (with your family) to give thanks to God for the year that has ended and to ask for the help of the Holy Spirit for the year that has just begun. Last, but certainly not least, a big **THANK YOU** to Gail Gargac, Cathy Cassy, and Howard Shim, and all who assisted them with beautifully decorating our church, with singing at multiple Masses in a short span of days, and with serving at the altar. God bless all of you for your generosity.

CATECHISM CORNER

This section is meant to serve as a "Did You Know" or "Frequently Asked Questions" blurb about the faith.

Today's column is a "Did You Know?" about the traditional prayers that accompany the new year. I would encourage you to pray them with your family, or any group of people that is willing to pray together.

For year's end, the traditional prayer of Thanksgiving is the *Te Deum* (To God we give praise). You can watch Pope Francis pray this prayer as part of Evening Prayer at the Vatican on the afternoon of Sunday the 31st on EWTN. Here is the text:

We praise thee, O God: we acknowledge thee to be the Lord.
All the earth doth worship thee: the Father everlasting.
To thee all Angels cry aloud: the Heavens, and all the Powers therein.
To thee Cherubim and Seraphim: continually do cry,
Holy, Holy, Holy: Lord God of Sabaoth;
Heaven and earth are full of the Majesty: of thy glory.
The glorious company of the Apostles: praise thee.
The goodly fellowship of the Prophets: praise thee.
The noble army of Martyrs: praise thee.
The holy Church throughout all the world: doth acknowledge thee;
The Father: of an infinite Majesty;
Thine honourable, true: and only Son;
Also the Holy Ghost: the Comforter.
Thou art the King of Glory: O Christ.
Thou art the everlasting Son: of the Father.
When thou tookest upon thee to deliver man: thou didst not abhor the Virgin's womb.
When thou hadst overcome the sharpness of death: thou didst open the Kingdom of Heaven to all believers.
Thou sittest at the right hand of God: in the glory of the Father.
We believe that thou shalt come: to be our Judge.
We therefore pray thee, help thy servants: whom thou hast redeemed with thy precious blood.

Make them to be numbered with thy Saints: in glory everlasting.
O Lord, save thy people: and bless thine heritage.
Govern them: and lift them up for ever.
Day by day: we magnify thee;
And we worship thy Name: ever world without end.
Vouchsafe, O Lord: to keep us this day without sin.
O Lord, have mercy upon us: have mercy upon us.
O Lord, let thy mercy lighten upon us: as our trust is in thee.
O Lord, in thee have I trusted: let me never be confounded. Amen.

The prayer to begin the new year to ask for God's help is the *Veni Creator Spiritus* (Come, Creator Spirit)

Come, Holy Spirit, Creator blest,
and in our souls take up Thy rest;
come with Thy grace and heavenly aid
to fill the hearts which Thou hast made.

O comforter, to Thee we cry,
O heavenly gift of God Most High,
O fount of life and fire of love,
and sweet anointing from above.

Thou in Thy sevenfold gifts are known;
Thou, finger of God's hand we own;
Thou, promise of the Father, Thou
Who dost the tongue with power imbue.

Kindle our sense from above,
and make our hearts o'erflow with love;
with patience firm and virtue high
the weakness of our flesh supply.

Far from us drive the foe we dread,
and grant us Thy peace instead;
so shall we not, with Thee for guide,
turn from the path of life aside.

Oh, may Thy grace on us bestow
the Father and the Son to know;
and Thee, through endless times confessed,
of both the eternal Spirit blest.

Now to the Father and the Son,
Who rose from death, be glory given,
with Thou, O Holy Comforter,
henceforth by all in earth and heaven. Amen.

I hope these prayers help you transition not only from year to year but day to day. Each in our own way giving thanks to God at the end of each day and calling on the help of the Holy Spirit each new morning. May God grant you a fruitful 2018 as His servant!
